POSITION OVERVIEW

Katimavik seeks a highly motivated, organized, and independent person to join our team as a Diversity Engagement Officer.

The Diversity Engagement Officer is responsible for leading the Truth and Reconciliation portfolio for Katimavik staff and Participants, and for helping to broaden the diversity of Program Participants, with a specific focus on Indigenous youth, Black youth, youth of colour, and 2SLGBTQ+ youth.

Truth and Reconciliation

- Manage the Truth and Reconciliation learning platform, integrate Truth and Reconciliation activities and priorities across all programs, and facilitate Truth and Reconciliation learning sessions with program participants

- Work to establish relationships with Indigenous partners and organizations in communities where programs operate

Stakeholder Diversification

- Develop strategies and plans to broaden the diversity of program participants with specific focus on Indigenous youth, Black youth, youth of colour, and LGBTQ2+ youth
- Organize and facilitate presentations and discussion forums between program participants and thought leaders from Canada's diverse communities, including youth activists from within these communities

- Demonstrated knowledge and understanding of Indigenous issues and culture
